

DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK 2026

Competition rules

I. Event Objective:

- a) Promoting cycling sports, particularly downhill.
- b) Popularizing the urban version of downhill.
- c) Promoting a healthy lifestyle from an early age.
- d) Selecting the best competitors in each category.
- e) Creating and popularizing social attitudes and behaviors based on the values of physical activity.
- f) Supporting the development of local communities.

II. Organizer

BIKE RACE TEAM Development and Sports Foundation, with its registered office in Rybnik at 159c Wodzisławska Street, 44-200 Rybnik, entered into the Register of Associations, Other Social and Professional Organizations, Foundations, and Independent Public Healthcare Institutions maintained by the District Court in Gliwice, 10th Commercial Division of the National Court Register, under the KRS number 0001086656; Tax Identification Number (NIP) 6423250842, National Business Registry Number (REGON) 527712497.

III. Categories

- WOMEN (born 2016 and older) Athletes in a given age group.
- HARDTAIL (born 2016 and older) Athletes competing on bikes without rear suspension, in a given age group.
- OPEN (born 2007-1992) Athletes competing on bikes with full front and rear suspension, in a given age group.
- JUNIOR (born 2008-2016) Athletes born in a given age group.
- MASTERS (born 1991 and earlier) Athletes competing on full suspension bikes, born in a given age group.

IV. Conditions of Participation

- Submitting the electronic entry form and paying the registration fee, which constitutes acceptance of these Regulations, or completing and signing the entry form at the race office.
- Collecting your bib number at the race office.
- Completing at least one training run before the start of the timed runs. The training run will be recorded at the start.
- Possession of a functional bicycle with two working brakes, a full-face helmet, and a spine protector or chest protector (a protective vest covering the chest and spine).
- The organizer reserves the right to prohibit a competitor from starting if it is determined that the technical condition of the bicycle or protective equipment may pose a threat to the safety of the competitor or other participants.
- Consent to the processing of personal data provided in the entry form.

- Minors may participate in the race only with the written consent of a parent or legal guardian.
- Consent to the free use of the image recorded in the form of a photograph or video recording. The Participant grants the Personal Data Controller and the Organizer a non-exclusive, territorially unlimited license to use the recorded image in the following fields of use:

- Recording and reproducing it using any known technique and distributing it in any form
- Providing sponsors and official partners with a copy or duplicate of the recorded image for use in promoting the sponsor or official partner regarding its participation in DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK
- Saving it to computer memory and a multimedia network
- Reproducing the recorded image
- Publicly exhibiting, displaying, reproducing, broadcasting, and rebroadcasting it, as well as making it publicly available so that everyone can access it at a place and time of their choosing
- Posting and publishing it in the press, on websites, posters, and billboards
- Broadcasting it on television and radio
- Publishing the participant's photos from the competition on social media

V. Entry Fees

As part of the entry fee, each participant receives:

- professional medical coverage
- commemorative race number
- professional timing during the race
- additional benefits if partners are acquired

The entry fee can be paid online directly from the race registration page.

Entry fees:

PLN 150 for those registered online, payment must be made online directly from the competition registration website by August 23, 2026

PLN 200 for those registered online, payment must be made online directly from the competition registration website by September 4, 2026

PLN 250 for those registering and paying the entry fee at the competition office on September 6, 2026 (cash payment only)

The fee paid by the participant is non-refundable in the event of withdrawal, failure to complete the run, or other reasons beyond the Organizer's control.

VI. Competition Rules

Training

- Official training is permitted only after all registration formalities have been completed and bib numbers are issued.
- During training, competitors must wear a bib number plate on their bikes.
- Official training will take place according to the minute schedule below.
- Training on the race course outside of the officially designated times is prohibited.

Competition

- Time is measured over two runs on the officially marked course.
- The best time counts for the final classification.

- To be considered a valid run, a competitor must complete all constructed obstacles, regardless of whether they can be avoided (this does not apply if the organizer designates a chicken line on the map).
- If the organizer designates a detour (Chicken Line), completing this route is considered a successful completion of the obstacle.
- Competitors start at 60-second intervals. Failure to arrive at the start within the allotted time may result in disqualification or being moved to the end of the starting list, if the competition schedule allows. (In the event of a large number of participants, the interval may be shortened.)
- Competitors start with official numbers provided by the organizer, located on the handlebar at the front of their bikes.

VII. Safety Regulations:

- Race marshals are stationed along the course to signal dangers along the course.
- Race marshals are equipped with red flags.
- The red flag is used to signal an accident or other hazard on the course. A competitor who notices a red flag is required to stop immediately and follow the instructions of the marshals or safety personnel.

VIII. Competitor Limit

The limit for competitors who can participate in the competition is 100. (The organizer reserves the right to allocate an additional 20 spots.)

The limit for junior categories is 40.

IX. Prizes

- Cash and in-kind prizes will be awarded for the following categories: OPEN, JUNIOR, WOMEN, HARDTAIL, and MASTERS.
- The cash prize pool for the DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK competition is PLN 9,200.
- The cash prize pool from partners will be transferred 14 days before the competition.
- Cash prizes will be awarded for places 1-5 in the WOMEN AND OPEN categories: I - PLN 1,200 II - PLN 1,000 III - PLN 900 IV - PLN 800 V - PLN 700
- Cash prizes will be awarded for places 1-5 in the JUNIOR, HARDTAIL, and MASTERS categories.

The organizer reserves the right to increase the cash and in-kind prize pool.

X. Competition Program:

7:00 AM - 9:30 AM - Safety briefing and final course adjustments.

9:00 AM - Start lists posted in the competition office

9:30 AM - 11:00 AM - Training for all categories

11:15 AM - 1:15 PM - 1st run

1:30 PM - 3:30 PM - 2nd run

30 minutes after the end of the 2nd run - Winners' awards ceremony

- The final schedule will be published no later than 7 days before the competition.
- The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the schedule for reasons beyond the Organizer's control.
- The second round of competitions and the awards ceremony may be postponed depending on the number of participants.

- The Organizer reserves the right to change the course of the route, the competition schedule, or cancel individual runs for safety reasons, weather conditions, or other circumstances beyond the Organizer's control.
- In the event of interruption of the competition for safety reasons, the Organizer may consider the results of the first run as the final results.

XI. Additional competitions

The regulations for individual additional competitions will be included in the annexes.

XII. Penalties

The Chief Referee may impose the following penalties:

- Warning
- Time penalty
- Disqualification
- and other penalties in accordance with PZKol regulations.
- Failure to comply with the instructions of the referees or security personnel may result in immediate disqualification.

XIII. Organizer's Obligations and Liabilities

- The Organizer does not provide Participants with any life, health, or liability insurance for illness, accident, injury, death, or any loss or damage that may occur in connection with attendance and/or participation in DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK.
- The Organizer reserves the right to permit medical and paramedical personnel employed by or on behalf of the Organizer to provide first aid or perform other medical procedures, as well as transport an injured participant to a safe location. The Participant consents to the above. Participants participate in the competition at their own risk and acknowledge that participation in the competition involves physical exertion and carries inherent risks and hazards of accidents, the possibility of bodily injury and physical harm (including death), as well as property damage and loss. Only individuals in good health and with no medical contraindications to participation should participate in the competition.
- Flights of unmanned aerial vehicles (drones) over the competition route are prohibited without the Organizer's consent.
- Action cameras may be used solely at the competitor's risk and in a manner that does not endanger the safety of the participants.
- The Organizer undertakes to provide all competitors with necessary medical care for the duration of the competition.
- The Organizer undertakes to secure the route by providing marshals and installing safety elements (tapes, fences, barriers, etc.).
- The Organizer undertakes to appropriately mark the Competition Office and inform competitors of the location no later than one week before the start of the competition.
- The Organizer is not responsible for any losses or damage to competitor property incurred in connection with participation in the competition.
- The Organizer is not responsible for any bodily harm suffered by competitors during the descent or training sessions.
- The Organizer is not responsible for any incidents occurring during travel to or from the Competition.
- The Organizer is not responsible for any collisions or accidents on the course;
- The Organizer is not responsible for any personal belongings of Competitors left unattended or for any items lost during the Competition;
- The Organizer is not responsible

for any personal injury, property damage, or property damage that occurs before, during, or after the Competition; • The Organizer is not responsible for any cancellation, change of date, or location of the Competition due to reasons beyond the Organizer's control.

XIV. Final Provisions

- The competition will be conducted in accordance with selected UCI and PZKol regulations;
- Competitors are subject to UCI and PZKol anti-doping regulations.
- Legal guardians are obligated to provide continuous supervision of participants before, during, and after the competition;
- Protests regarding the course of the competition, and in particular the classification of competitors, must be reported to the organizer during the competition until the completion of the timed runs;
- Competitors are required to obtain their own insurance;
- Each participant participates in the competition at their own risk (in the case of underage competitors, at the risk of their parents or legal guardians);
- Persons without starting numbers riding bicycles on the course will be removed from the course by technical staff;
- Lack of knowledge of the regulations will not be accepted as an excuse;
- All competitors are asked not to litter the slope and to take particular care of the natural environment.
- Competitors are required to maintain good manners and adhere to the principles of fair play.
- The Race Director has the right to refuse entry to a competitor without providing a reason, or if there is a suspicion that the competitor is under the influence of performance-enhancing substances, alcohol, or other intoxicating substances, or if the Race Director deems that the competitor's participation may pose a risk to the competitor or third parties, or may harm the image of the competition or disrupt the course of the competition.
- Registration for the competition constitutes acceptance of the applicable regulations.
- The interpretation of these regulations rests with the Head Judge in consultation with the Race Director.

XV. Processing of Personal Data

Pursuant to Article 13 paragraphs 1 and 2 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (General Data Protection Regulation - GDPR) (OJ EU L 119, 2016, p. 1), we hereby inform you that:

1. The Personal Data Controller is the BIKE RACE TEAM Development and Sport Foundation with its registered office in Rybnik at ul. Wodzisławska 159c, 44-200 Rybnik (hereinafter referred to as the "Data Controller").
2. Personal data, including first name, last name, address, and email address, were obtained directly from the data subject or from the legal guardian (parents) exercising direct authority over the minor.
3. Participants' personal data will be processed for the purpose of organizing the DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK event in accordance with Article 6(1)(a)-(f) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council (GDPR), and in the case of special categories of data, in accordance with Article 9(2) of the GDPR. The legitimate interest pursued by the Data Controller is the obligation arising from the organization of the event, the selection of the winner and the awarding, delivery, and collection of the prize, and

the promotion of the City of Rybnik and MOSiR Rybnik by the organizers, co-organizers, and sponsors.

4. The recipients of your personal data will be: the Competition Organizer, the staff supporting the DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK event, and the Rybnik City Hall.
5. Your personal data will be stored for a period of 5 years.
6. You have the right to access your children's personal data, the right to request rectification, erasure, or restriction of processing of this data, and the right to data portability.
7. For reasons related to your particular situation, you have the right to object to the processing of your data without providing a reason, as you are entitled to object when the data being processed is used for purposes other than those indicated.
8. You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, which, however, will not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.
9. You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates the law.
10. Providing your personal data is voluntary. You are obligated to provide it, and failure to provide your personal data will result in the participant's ineligibility to participate in the DROP TO THE CITY RYBNIK event.
11. Personal data will not be processed in an automated manner, including profiling.
